

**PROCLAMATION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF  
THE CITY OF YORBA LINDA, CALIFORNIA,  
EXPRESSING SUPPORT FOR ARIZONA'S ADOPTION OF  
SENATE BILL 1070**

**WHEREAS**, the City Council of the City of Yorba Linda affirms the integrity of the international borders of these United States and the Constitutional authority and duty of the federal government to guard and to protect those borders, including the regulation of the numbers and of the qualifications of immigrants into the country; and

**WHEREAS**, the State of Arizona, who, like the State of California, is in the dire straits of enduring the brunt of most of the illegal crossings of the national border, has passed Arizona Senate Bill 1070, which was signed by Governor Jan Brewer on April 23, 2010; and

**WHEREAS**, this Arizona law enables its law enforcement officers to enforce federal immigration law using federal standards protecting the rights of all citizens, and are required to do so without violating civil rights and without resorting to racial profiling; and


**WHEREAS**, the Arizona law does not require new documentation, such as a national ID card, but uses existing identification documentation to establish a presumption of legal status; and

**WHEREAS**, the federal government has failed in its obligation to secure borders and protect United States citizens from the financial and physical security aspects of illegal immigration.

**NOW, THEREFORE, I, John Anderson**, Mayor of the City of Yorba Linda, along with a majority of my City Council colleagues, Mayor Pro Tem Nancy Rikel and Councilmember Mark Schwing, do hereby proclaim the City of Yorba Linda's support for Arizona's adoption of Senate Bill 1070. The City of Yorba Linda stands with the people of Arizona and applauds the State of Arizona and its Governor Jan Brewer for its recent action to protect and defend its citizens, our country, and the sovereignty of the United States of America.

The City Council of the City of Yorba Linda further proclaims that it supports the proposition that the individual states of this country should be able to defend themselves in a manner consistent with the United States Constitution when it comes to matters of defending its citizens, our country, and the sovereignty of the United States of America.
